<sup>2</sup> **Partnership and PACE** integrate a person's long-term care services, health and medical services (acute/primary care), and prescription medications. All medical care is integrated into the benefits.

<sup>3</sup> **IRIS (Include, Respect, I Self-Direct)** is a self-directed, long-term care option for elderly people and adults with disabilities where resources are creatively used to help the individual achieve the life they want with the support they need.

<sup>4</sup> **CLTS** waivers provide children with a variety of individualized services including in-home intensive treatment services.
